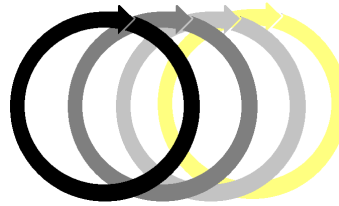


Paul-Timothy Reproduction Cycle

Paul-Timothy materials can help you and your co-workers train others who accomplish five outcomes in ever-repeating cycles of reproduction:

1. Increase new believers
2. Reproduce obedient disciples
3. Multiply little churches
4. Extend generations of new leaders
5. Expand into new regions



Wherever God allowed Jesus’ apostles to accomplish these five outcomes, they empowered new workers to do the same in turn, to a fourth generation and beyond.

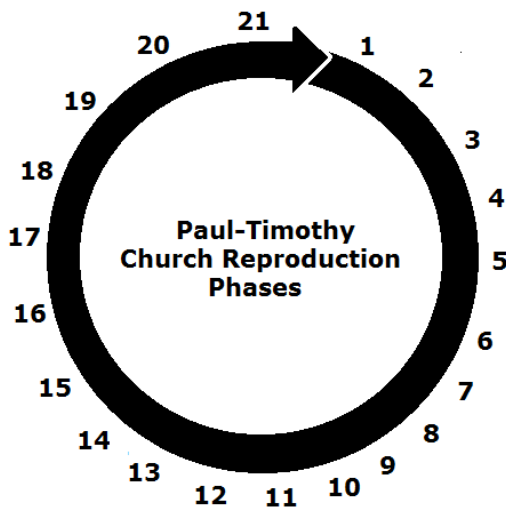
Read **2 Timothy 2:1-2** and find how many generations of workers Paul empowered.

(Answer: Christ, Paul, Timothy, faithful folk, others also.)

Read **Acts 14:21-24**. Find several phases that the apostles implemented in the starting of new churches. This process took only a few months to accomplish.

(Answer: (1) Form and send a small team. (2) Share the Good News in several places. (3) Teach new believers to obey Jesus’ commandments. (3) Return and strengthen the faith of new disciples. (4) Appoint elders in each new gathering. (5) Move on to start again in other places.)

Paul-Timothy studies provide a menu of simple lessons that coaches share with local leaders in each of 21 phases and steps. Phases and steps can occur in any order and may overlap.



**Phases and steps can happen in any order, and they may overlap.**

**Birth**

1. Envision and pray for a movement
2. Form small, temporary teams
3. Agree on methods and goals
4. seek out several men of peace
5. Let the Good News flow in their networks
6. Baptise and enfold new believers
7. Make disciples who obey Jesus' commands

**Growth**

8. Gather to worship and obey Jesus
9. Celebrate the Lord's Supper often
10. Coach local men who lead gatherings
11. Strengthen faith with sound doctrine
12. Train everyone to share the Good News
13. Empower everyone to start gatherings
14. Train leaders to coach new leaders

**Reproduction**

15. Track outcomes and lay new plans
16. Seek several linages of new gatherings
17. Seek several generations of gatherings
18. Edit simple training materials for coaches
19. Ordain elders within clusters of gatherings
20. Send small teams to needy communities
21. Develop new ministries in older churches
