  - Be diligent in life and service.

# CVI Introduced

## Origin

Community Vision International (CVI) was organized as an Oregon non-profit corporation in July, 2001, and obtained federal non-profit 501(C)3 status in 2002.

## Mandate

The Great Commandments and Great Commission motivate our obedience in spirit, deeds and service.

## Values

We value God's great love and grace, Christ's completed work and lordship, the Holy Spirit's global agency and unlimited capacity, humanity in God's image, and free, biblical holism. We value truth that transforms, obedience to the God-head, Church in three forms (universal, community and local), mercy, compassion, intercession, visionaries, biblical stewardship and God's provision, capacity-building, inverted organization structures, cultural alertness (diversity, sensitivity, relevance), and tolerance in all relationships (love, humility, respect, kindness). We value holistic service, sound thinking, thoughtful planning, careful communication, active participation, natural growth through supernatural means, reproductive and transferable methods, and appropriate technologies.

## Vision

To see the kingdom of God being incarnated within God-given, visionary-community relationships, advancing powerfully through human networks.

## Mission

Enabling visionaries to transform communities, using available resources and transferable technologies, skills and tools.

## Style

Responsive, facilitating, serving, low-profile, low-cost.

## Focus

- Identifying inadequately-addressed needs of social groups where God is at work.
- Discovering visionaries who want to help meet those needs.
- Providing structures that enable visionaries through prayer, coaching, training, communication, networking, resourcing.

## Desired Outcomes

- Transformed communities (socio-cultural units).
- Value added to global community transformation efforts.
- New, expanding and enabled networks of community transformation groups, consultants and workers.
- Reproductive, disciple-making groups of various forms.
- Multiplied visionaries who love people, desire to see them disciplined, and who respond to true service needs.

## Activities

CVI<sup>2</sup> has adopted the World Evangelical Alliance statement of faith, unchanged and in its entirety:

One **God**, eternally existent in three persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit...

The **Salvation** of lost and sinful man through the shed blood of the Lord Jesus Christ by faith apart from works, and regeneration by the Holy Spirit...

The **Holy Spirit**, by whose indwelling the believer is enabled to live a holy life, to witness and work for the Lord Jesus Christ...

The **Unity** of the Spirit of all true believers, the Church, the Body of Christ...

The **Resurrection** of both the saved and the lost; they that are saved unto the resurrection of life, they that are lost unto the resurrection of damnation.
